Great Grandfather: Michael George Lang Sr. (1866-1939)


- Family believed he came from Lapsam Germany.
- Could not find any record of such a place, searched through countless maps and atlas of Germany.


Where did he come From? Who was his father?

- The village is named Lobsann











"I cannot but feel a little sad this morning for my thoughts continually revert to those dear absent brothers who were wont to share our Christmas cheer and gladden the hours of the festive season for us. Poor boys! I wonder if they think of the blazing hearthstone at old "Bel Air" and wish for a place in the home – circle."

Chapter one, December 25th, 1861, to May 13th, 1862.

While following my 5th great grandparents. I came across the Buck surname that marries into my line. William Richardson (1712-1768) has a daughter who marries into another old English line named Buck. All of Virginia. I now have 147 Buck family members in my


When I got to Lucy Rebecca Buck, I discovered through Google that a book had been published about her days in the Civil War, in Confederate Virginia.

Her family being in Front Royal, Shenandoah Valley, Virginia.

This started my journey with her. I researched her whole family. Taking them back to Colonial Virginia in 1649. Many of the family fighting in the Revolutionary War as Patriots.

I found a copy of her book at the Wisconsin Historical Society and had it sent to the Mequon Library. You will not put it down and you will need a very large box of Kleenex.

I have a signed First edition by the author. I do not want to loan it out but if you are interested, you can get it from the WHS in Madison. There are also copies on the internet.



In early Feb of 2022. I got up and had coffee then booked a hotel and a rental car in Front Royal and hopped on Amtrak before noon.

I was in Harpers Ferry, WV. The next morning. Took and Uber to Charles City to get my rental car and then drove to Front Royal.

I toured around the area and went to several different cemeteries.

I knew where she was buried but waited until a light layer of snow melted. Then I went up to Prospect Hill Cemetery. It is VERY OLD.

The Buck Family and all of the friends and cousins are buried at the very top. They look easy to the sunrise over the Washington Mountains and can see Old Bel Air at the edge of the Village.





As I was leaving this little girl came over and said HI.

I named her LUCY.





I got up early to get this shot and then drove to Strasburg that she talks about and had breakfast.


Lucy on the left and her sister Nelli on the right.

Lucy and Nellie never married. Her diary was lost after her death until found by this editor wrapped in cloth at a library.

She had 8 brothers and three sisters.

Lucy and Nelli lived a quite life after the war. Visiting with family and friends. Lucy died in 1918 and Nelli died in 1902.
