

MEMORIES – Bob Tatalovich walked us through the Memories section of Family Search.

- There were a number of reasons to add this tool, many of which help organize and be able to expand the story of your ancestors, far beyond DOB,DOD.
- The add criteria will be screened.
- Add audios "how I remember Grandpa..."
- Add stories written tales to accompany docs or stand alone
- Add files numerous ways to tie in to people.
- You can tag people and add details along with enriching content like year, location and captions.
- Add up to 15MGB each.
- Especially helpful when adding photos to tree information!
- Add multiple photos and documents to create a timeline effect of someone's life.
- Find all added items in YOUR GALLERY section in 3 divisions
 - MY MEMORIES
 - MY ARCHIVES
 - MY ALBUMS
- In the Family History Guide go to
 - LEARNING PATH then it can go to Family Search, then MEMORIES
 - There is full tutoring on how to do all functions that Bob addressed in this presentation

MATRICULA - Bob Heck introduced us to a German site which is a collection of primarily Catholic vitals. Parent site is ICARUS https://www.icar-us.eu/en/

 In this strong up and growing fast site, it has several breakout avenues to investigate.

MONASTERIUM

 Primarily filled with Monks noting land documentation

MATRICULA

- Church docs in Europe, majority Catholic
- Bob covered in depth definitely worth watching the presentation again to get all the options
- The quality is great! He had several comparisons to other microfiche copies and the difference is outstanding. In one example you could not read the name from the copied doc but the Matricula version was a clear read.

TOPOTHEQUE

 The regional-history work of reference. The online-archive where you can contribute personally and directly to the material.

ARCHIVNET

- This is another source however it is currently being renovated for this entire year. Might be a good one to review next year once it's back up and refreshed.
- Discussed FONDS which are archival places
 - Contains many parish records and you can search by City, then parishes.
 - o (right click to translate)
 - Birth and Christening
 - Marriages
 - Deaths
